The undersigned incorporator desiring to form a corporation pursuant to the Indiana Nonprofit Corporation Act of 1991 (hereinafter the "Act") hereby executes the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE I

NAME

The name of this corporation is Interwoven By Jesus, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as the "Corporation").

ARTICLE II

PURPOSES AND POWERS

Section 2.1 Purposes. The purposes for which the Corporation is formed are exclusively charitable, religious and educational and consist of the following:

A. The specific and primary purposes are:

1. to encourage the love of Jesus Christ among individuals residing in and around the Indianapolis neighborhood commonly known as Mapleton-Fall Creek;
2. to attempt to raise the economic, educational, social and spiritual levels of said residents, including members of the minority community, who are substantially unemployed, underemployed, or whose income is below federal poverty guidelines; to foster and promote community-wide interest and concern for the problems of said residents to the end that (a) sickness, poverty, crime and environmental degradation may be lessened, and (b) racial tensions, prejudice, and discrimination, economic and otherwise, may be eliminated;
3. to expand the opportunities available to said residents and groups to

own, manage, and operate business enterprises in economically depressed areas; to assist said residents and groups in developing entrepreneurial and management skills necessary for the successful operation of business enterprises; and to assist said residents and groups in obtaining financial support from other sources.

- B. The general purposes and powers are to have and exercise all rights and powers conferred on corporations formed under the Act, provided, however, that the Corporation shall not, except to an insubstantial degree, engage in any activities or exercise any powers that are not in furtherance of the specific and primary purposes of the Corporation.

Section 2.2 Public Benefit Corporation. This is a public benefit corporation as defined by the Act.

Section 2.3 Tax-Exempt Purposes.

- A. The Corporation is organized and operated exclusively for charitable and educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the Corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (i) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provisions of any future United State Internal Revenue Law), or (ii) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Law.)
- B. No substantial part of the activities of this corporation shall consist of the carrying on of propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, nor shall this Corporation participate in or intervene in (including the publishing or distributing of statements) any political campaign on behalf of

(or in opposition to) any candidate for public office.

C. If the Corporation is or becomes a private foundation within the meaning of the Internal Revenue Code, the Corporation shall:

1. Cause its income for each taxable year to be distributed at such time and in such manner as not to subject the Corporation to tax under Section 4942;
2. Engage in no act of self-dealing as defined in Section 4943(c);
3. Make no investment in such manner as to subject the Corporation to tax under Section 4944; and
4. Make no taxable expenditure as defined in Section 4945(d).

ARTICLE VII

DISTRIBUTION OF ASSETS ON DISSOLUTION OR FINAL LIQUIDATION

The property of the Corporation is irrevocably dedicated to charitable and educational purposes and no part of the net income or assets of this corporation shall ever inure to the benefit of any director, officer, or member thereof or to the benefit of any private person. Upon the dissolution or winding up of the Corporation, its assets remaining after payment, or provision for payment, of all debts and liabilities of this corporation shall be distributed to a nonprofit fund, foundation or corporation which is organized and operated exclusively for charitable and educational purposes and which has established its tax exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.
